We are extremely grateful and pleased to announce our results of 2019. We excelled in the NSSCH examinations with a total of 64 1-gradings (10 more than 2018) and 81 2-gradings (11 more than 2018).

A remarkable 42% of all the subjects written in grade 12 in the external examinations were taken on the Higher Level. 92.42% of the subjects written were quality symbols -1, 2 or 3 gradings. WBPHS is ranked 2nd in the National school rankings with our outstanding results.
